Born to Swim Clinic with Sabir Muhammed Sunday, April 21, 2013

Sabir Muhammad (born April 14, 1976 in Louisville, KY) is an American swimmer. He represented the USA in international competition as a butterfly and freestyle swimmer. Sabir graduated from Stanford University in 1998. Sabir finished his collegiate career with 7 Pac-10 championship titles, 25 All-American honors and 3 NCAA, US Open and American Records. Sabir graduated from Stanford as an Academic All-American with a degree in International Relations. Sabir holds an MBA from Goizueta Business School at Emory University. In 2000, he competed in the Short Course World Championships held in Athens, Greece winning both silver and bronze medals. At those world championships, Sabir became the first African-American to win a medal at a major international swimming competition. He has broken a total of 10 American Records in his career. He is a two time Short Course World Championship medalist, a four-time US Open champion, a five-time World Cup Swimming Champion and a two-time runner-up at US Nationals.

Sabir has been an advocate for <u>swimming</u> in multicultural communities for nearly 15 years. In 2003, he helped found a learn-to-swim program with the <u>Boys and Girls Clubs</u> of <u>Metro Atlanta</u> that eventually became a pilot for <u>USA Swimming</u>'s <u>Make a Splash Program in 2007.</u>
