Conference Call on Zoom, 7:30 pm**

- Attendance – Cherlynn Venit, Trish Buswell, Ellen Colket, Aaron Dean, Jim Crampton, Cliff Gordan, Barb Ship, Nicole Erickson, Matt Cohen, Nicole Zhang, Zach Surez. Non-voting members: Kim Bullers, Tim Husson, Karyn McCannon
- Call to order – The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by General Chair, Cherlynn Venit
- Introductions/Roll Call – There are a sufficient number of voting board members to conduct business.
- Consent Agenda – No additional reports were requested to be pulled.
  - **Motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented, seconded and approved.**
  - **Motion to approve the agenda as presented, seconded and approved.**
- Administrative Update
  - PVS Swim Camps – PVS hosted a Fitter & Faster Camp on April 6 at University of Maryland. Cherlynn, Nicole Erickson and Jim Crampton were there to assist. There were two sessions of 36 swimmers and a waitlist of over 100. We will be planning to host at least two similar camps during the 2025-2026 season. In addition, F&F are offering to hold coaches' clinics which can be used for continuing education credit. These clinics can be offered at the end of any camps that F&F hosts in the PVS area, at little to no cost. We will need to let him know what topics we want to cover so the appropriate clinician can be brought in. F&F is looking for ways to work with PVS and to help our coaches and swimmers.
    - The swimmers in attendance had great things to say about the clinics.
  - Financial Report – The report was submitted by Ellen Colket, Finance Vice-Chair.
    - Investment portfolio has shown a slight decline, just a little over 1%. This is likely due to recent tariffs. It is to be expected that we will see some ups and downs in our investments over the next few months.
  - Budget vs Actual (March 2024/March 2025) – Ellen highlighted the following:
    - We are currently 7 months into the budget year and our numbers look to be doing well and on track. When we look year over year, March 24-March 25, our income is down by \$49K. This decrease is

due in part to meet entries being down by 4% and the club credit of \$500 per club we gave in support of our clubs.

- Facility rental is less than we had budgeted for. We had anticipated/budgeted for a 20% increase in facility rental. However, the increase was in the 8-10% range. Additionally, the Meet Management fees were less than budgeted due to fewer than expected meet entries at the Open Meets.
  - The introduction of Block Parties resulted in a 6.2% loss in splash fees. It will be a year or two before we will be able to determine if Block Parties achieve the goal of introducing and retaining more swimmers in the sport.
  - FLEX membership has increased.
- LC Zones Prep Status – Ellen Reported that we have started planning for the LC Zones. Contracts for the hotels and buses have been signed and the deposit for the buses has been paid. We are planning for ninety (90) 11-14 year old swimmers and forty (40) 10 & Under swimmers. All meals and lodging will be provided for the 11-14 year olds, coaches and bus drivers. The 10 & U will be self travel and responsible for their own lodging and travel.
  - Fees will be set at: \$795 for the 11 & Over and \$175 (10 & U).
- Action Items/Motions – nothing to report.
- Old Business
  - Proposal for USA-S HOD regarding VSI – Cherlynn had a long conversation with MD Swimming and USA Swimming. Maryland Swimming prefers not to share any counties with PVS and would like our current agreement to stay as it is.
    - Virginia Swimming voted down our proposal at their House of Delegates, without issuing a counter proposal. Their HOD passed a change to their policy that PVS will follow VSI rules unless the team is from outside VSI and have a specific agreement with VSI, and the club will follow their home LSC rules.
    - The sticking point is that they want their \$2.50 per athlete.
    - We can continue to also charge the \$.55 splash fee for PVS meets that are held in VSI and ensure that meet announcements have everything VSI requires.
    - It seems there are two roads forward if we want to proceed with taking action with USA-S HOD and the idea of sharing the two counties.

- 1. Make an amendment to rules and amend the territories. To do this we need to submit by May 15
- 2. Follow the 607 section of the rule book, and attempt to share the counties. VSI has already turned this idea down, so now we would be sending the request to Rules & Reg Committee to look into the matter. We would present our case in writing, then there will be a public hearing at the Annual Business Meeting in September. Then R&R would make a recommendation at HOD.
- We will need to inform the PVS HOD of the board's plans to petition USA-S HOD.
- **Motion to proceed with submitting the proposal to USA-S as a 603 change and submit for the Rules and Reg meeting on April 30, seconded and approved.**
  - Change the 607.2 statements for VSI and PVS, by adding in that we will share Loudoun & Prince William and city of Manassas, allowing both LSC to sanctions in these counties.
  - We need to make sure we have the data on how many meets are at the facilities in the counties/cities in question. Tim Husson will compile and send the needed information on the facilities and meets for the data needed.
- If we come up with an agreement with VSI, can we withdraw? No, but we can state we are no longer putting in for the change.
- We can still submit the same territory change. The concern is the 603 will turn into a 607.
- Budget
  - End of Year projection – It is anticipated that we will have a 3.5% increase in athlete registration, with an increase in FLEX membership.
  - Registration income is a bit higher than expected, but our meet entries are down slightly. LC Distance and LC Champs are included in the projections, so there could still be some changes to these numbers once the meet data is in.
  - \$74K of the meet entry fees are from surcharges.
  - For the 2024-2025 season, we issued 37 clubs a \$500 credit. We have previously voted not to offer this credit in the 25-26 season, however, we did vote to pay for the Club Renewal Registration fee of \$275.

- Total income is projected to be about \$6K short of what we budgeted.
- On the expense side, the projected Meet Management fees of \$152K. The rest is very similar to the budgeted amounts.
  - Based on what we budgeted for VSI surcharge for end of year 2025, we had fewer meets in VSI then we projected. We might be able to reduce this going forward.
- Meet support and expenses are coming in as projected and we will keep the numbers the same in 2026.
- Budget items were reviewed line by line, ensuring that Ellen has all the needed data to complete the proposed 2026 budget.
- Net income Meets 2019-2025 – (Ellen shared a chart) interested to show where we are with net income. This chart showed the PVS meets where we make money and where we spend money. Quite a bit of our income comes from the Open meets, and we invest a significant amount into the other meets (Distance and Championship meets).
  - **Motion to approve the budget as presented for presentation at the 2025 HOD meeting, seconded and approved.**
- Bullet Statements/Job Task for position up for election – Cherlynn asked that all positions that are up for election to make a list of their duties to pass on.
- BOD Nomination Status & Voting Procedures
  - Dave DiNardo and the Governance Committee is working on the election process for HOD.
  - At this year's meeting we will be voting on: General Chair, Finance Chair, Senior Chair, DEI Chair. All current members are eligible to serve a second term.
  - Official Representative, Coach Representative and Athlete Representative will be holding elections outside of HOD.
  - Dave will reach out to incumbents and do a write up to send out to the general membership.
- Coaches Rep Proposed Election Date –Nicole and Matt are working on it.
- Athlete Rep Proposed Election Date – Harper has a process. The information for Athlete reps is due April 30 and then do a post and will do a vote and have it due before May 20.
- Goals/Benchmarks for next month – please send to Cherlynn.

- Women in Governance LSC Nominees – Information was sent to PVS coaches and thus far we have received 7 nominations. All nominations are due May 1. Each LSC is allowed to nominate/send one participant. There are a total of 59 slots available. If there are any openings they will filled with other nominees.
- There will be a task force created to choose the PVS representative. Nicole, Trish, Nicole Z will all participate it the task force.

## General Chair Report PVS BOD Meeting 4-15-25

March was a busy month for all. The PVS Championship meets were well run thanks to NCAP and Machine Aquatics. Thank you to Karyn, Tom, Paris and their staff and families who volunteered. Thank you to Chris for partnering with Paris to bring about the medal award/photo opportunities for the Age Group Champs and working with her to create a more festive environment. A request for nominations for the Women in Governance program was sent out on March 31 via Flash Mail. To date, we have 7 interested/nominated individuals. All have been provided a form to complete to give the BOD the required information to decide who will be the PVS nominee. The form will also be sent with a 2<sup>nd</sup> notification email through Flash Mail. The deadline for submissions to the BOD is May 1. We will then need to vote on who the PVS nominee will be and submit their information by May 7. All others will then be notified that they can self-nominate to USA Swimming to fill any remaining spots once LSCs have submitted nominees.

PVS held its first PVS-sponsored swim camp in years on April 6<sup>th</sup>. Two sessions were held: 12 & Unders in the morning and 13 & Overs in the afternoon. We partnered with Fitter and Faster who provided the clinicians and advertising for the event and partnered in the cost. We supplemented the cost for each athlete and paid for the pool. Our clinicians were Josh White (former Associate Head Coach at Michigan), Tyler Clary (Olympic Gold medalist in

the 200m Backstroke in 2012) and Matthew Whelan (Atlantic 10 Champion in the 50-yard freestyle and Duke University record holder in the 200-yard butterfly). The camp focused on Starts, Turns, Underwaters and Breakouts and covered discussion topics including positivity and mental resilience, growth vs fixed mindset, perspective and gratitude, the mind-body connection, and mindfulness. Athletes enjoyed the camp with one specifically mentioning that “It was fun and informative, and even though I had heard some of the thoughts before, it was important to hear them again at a moment when they were the focus, and hearing them explained in a different way was extremely worthwhile.” We hope to continue partnering with Fitter and Faster for additional camps/clinics in the future and coaches’ clinics as well.

The Policy and Procedures document has been updated and posted to the website and now includes all changes approved by the Board through our March meeting.

I created a spreadsheet of all PVS-sponsored meets for the 2025-2026 season and asked the Operations Vice Chair to confirm the pool rentals and complete the contact information for each event/location. The spreadsheet was also provided for Terri to begin filling in hosts for the events.

The PVS Board continues to work towards a resolution to the VSI \$2.50 per athlete charge for meets held in counties adjacent to current PVS territory (Loudoun, Fauquier, Prince William and Stafford counties). We have sent numerous proposals to VSI that have been rejected. The Board is exploring other options currently.

The USA Swimming Annual Summit will be held September 24-27 in Denver with Safesport having their meeting on the Wednesday and Thursday leading up to Summit.

Our technical committee chairperson recently started a new job and has relocated to Nebraska thereby making it difficult to keep up with the incoming meet announcements. We have found a couple of people interested in stepping in to process the meet announcements and are working to arrange a training session for them. Currently, Terri has stepped up to review the meet announcements and has cleared the backlog. Thank you, Terri.

Finally, the PVS House of Delegates is set for Tuesday, May 20 at Overlee. During the meeting we will approve the 2025-2026 budget, endorse the changes made by the Board to the Policy & Procedures during the past year, approve the PVS Bylaws updates, and hold elections for the following positions: General Chair, Finance Vice Chair, Senior Chair, DEI Chair and 4 positions on the Governance/Nominating Committee (at least one athlete).



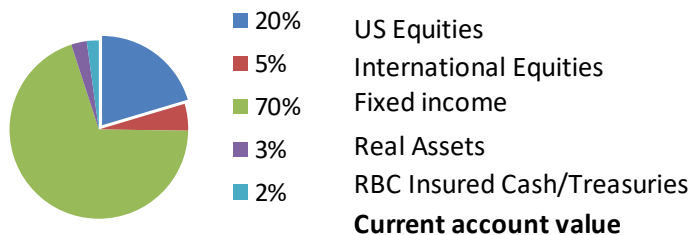


## Potomac Valley Swimming Finance Report as of 31-Mar-2025

### Financial Performance

Our investment portfolio, managed by RBC Wealth Management, has experienced a less than 1.2% decline as a result of the recent government imposed tariffs and subsequent market volatility. The allocation most impacted is U.S. Equities, which experienced a 5% decline month over month. Our overall portfolio remains anchored in a long-term strategic allocation with a low risk profile.

Our General Operating Account (GOA), Restricted Operating Account (ROA) and Special Accounts continue to remain within the Wells Fargo Banking Institution.

### 2025 Budget Performance

The P&L provided reflects income & expenses as of 7 months into the 2025 season. Our income to-date is 74% of the budget and attributed to: registration income (99%), PVS Meet Entries (73%), and the remainder is related to splash fees, equipment rental, donations, dividends and interest, and an offset of PVS club credits. Our expenses are approximately 42% of the budget and primarily composed of PVS Meet expenses, Club Equipment Grants, Annual Business Meeting expenses, Salaries, Payroll Taxes, Equipment Storage, Audit, and Property Tax costs.

### Top of Mind & Action required:

We are currently reflecting a projected end of year net income of \$34,174 as compared to a 2025 budgeted net income of <\$114,915>. Contributing to this delta are the following:

- ☐ **PVS Meets:** underspend of \$122.2k (pool rent \$77k and Meet Management fees of \$43k as a result of 12% fewer meet entries).
- ☐ **DEI:** underspend of \$7,5k
- ☐ **Open Water:** underspend of \$8k
- ☐ **Club & Coach Development:** underspend of \$7.3k

- ☐ Need to confirm if spends will occur in the following Expense categories:
  - **Health & Well Being initiative:** initial program costs and/or reimbursements. Will any of the budgeted \$14,000 be spent?
  - **DE&I Event:** need plan for \$5,500 estimate and spend schedule
  - **Open Water:** any firm commitments/expenditures
  - **LSC Strategy Meeting (mid-season):** is there a plan to hold this in 2025 season? If so, spend plan needed
- ☐ **Block Party meets** that were held between 1-Sep-2024 thru 1-Mar-2025 represent 6.2% of lost splash fees. Question to ask the clubs who have hosted these meets: **what are the statistics on membership growth and retention for your clubs because of the Block Party meets?**

### **ACTION REQUIRING YOUR ATTENTION**

- ☐ We are still waiting to receive UMD SC Champs and 14&u Champs pool rental invoices for events that occurred more than a month ago. This continues to delay the reconciliation and close of our books.
- ☐ **2026 Budget:** need final input for income and expense items for entry to budget NLT 15-April following the Board meeting.

### **Noteworthy items:**

- a. The 2025 Zones contract for lodging and catering has been signed. Buses have been reserved and deposit will be placed by end of April.
- b. The PVS club support program for the 2025 season was launched in early September and a \$500 goodwill credit was applied to 48 clubs. 30 clubs have fully used their credits, with the remaining 18 having some of their credit to-go. A second credit for \$70 has been applied to 48 clubs to cover their registration. PVS waived its fee LSC for club registration. All clubs with a credit balance were contacted the first week in April and offered a check or to continue to hold the balance on their account. Only 1 club to-date has requested a check and the others who have responded have requested to retain the credit balance on their account.
- c. Sponsorship and Advertising draft policy and rate schedule issued for review. Feedback received and awaiting another revision.
- d. The pilot with Wells Fargo's bill-pay service began in early December 2024 and continues. Currently, the initial findings are that there may not be as much of a savings (time nor money) than hoped, however, we will continue to assess this through the Summer months.
- e. The Athlete Scholarship program committee is being assembled with an initial meeting to be held no later than April 25<sup>th</sup> in order to launch the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of this program.
- f. We are upgrading to QuickBooks Enterprise Silver since the vendor, Intuit, is sunsetting the Premier version we currently use. Intuit and its partner, Right Networks, have made this a cost effective option for us.

- g. We are looking into the possibility of using Zelle via Wells Fargo as a means to collect athlete Zones registration fees as well as for the payment of certain vendors. We are still in the data gathering stage so if implemented, would not be online until the 2026 season.

### **Reminders:**

- We have less than 5 clubs to transition to ACH payment of bills.
- All reimbursement requests and other payables due by PVS must be submitted no later than 30 days following the expenditure/event. We need to promptly reconcile and close our books following the calendar end of each month.

#### **I. 1/3 of PVS Clubs are now Safe Sport Recognized Clubs (SSRC)**

- A. With the addition of **OCCS**, 16 of 48 PVS Clubs are Safe Sport Recognized Clubs: **ASA, CSC, DCPR, DRAG, FISH,, FXFX, LIFE, NCAP, OCCS. PAC, RIPS, SA, SDS, TOLL, TRA, and YORK**
- B. In Progress
- \* 4 clubs, **ERSC, AAC, ASTS, and STJ** have the **required 51/52 points to be SSRC** but not in the required categories **OR** are waiting for approval.
  - \* **WSH** has 47 points, **BWST** has committed to becoming a SSRC and has 44 points.
  - \* **TIBU, RY, RMSC, PM, PAVA, MAC** are in the first half of the process.
  - \* The committee has contacted each of the five new clubs offering help them become a SSRC. Of those five, **PAVA** has a Safe Sport Coordinator and started the process of becoming a SSRC and **ENSA** now has a Safe Sport Coordinator.
- C. 28 of 47 PVS clubs have a Safe Sport Coordinator: **AAC, ASA, ASTS, BWST, CSC, DCPR, DRAG, ENSA, FISH, FXFX, LIFE, NCAP, PAC, PAVA, PM, QOSA, RIPS, RMSC, RY, SDS, STJS, TIBU, TOLL, TRA, TSAC, WSH, YORK**
